## Passage of Study Luke 23:50-56

<sup>50</sup> And a man named Joseph, who was a member of the Council, a good and righteous man <sup>51</sup> (he had not consented to their plan and action), *a man* from Arimathea, a city of the Jews, who was waiting for the kingdom of God; <sup>52</sup> this man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. <sup>53</sup> And he took it down and wrapped it in a linen cloth and laid Him in a tomb cut into the rock, where no one had ever lain. <sup>54</sup> It was the preparation day, and the Sabbath was about to begin. <sup>55</sup> Now the women who had come with Him out of Galilee followed and saw the tomb and how His body was laid. <sup>56</sup> Then they returned and prepared spices and perfumes. And on the Sabbath, they rested according to the commandment.

# Parallel Passages of Study Matthew 27:57-61

<sup>57</sup> When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus. <sup>58</sup> This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given *to him*. <sup>59</sup> And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, <sup>60</sup> and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the entrance of the tomb and went away. <sup>61</sup> And Mary Magdalene was there, and the other Mary, sitting opposite the grave.

#### Mark 15:42-47

<sup>42</sup> When evening had already come, because it was the preparation day, that is, the day before the Sabbath, <sup>43</sup> Joseph of Arimathea came, a prominent member of the Council, who himself was waiting for the kingdom of God; and he gathered up courage and went in before Pilate, and asked for the body of Jesus. <sup>44</sup> Pilate wondered if He was dead by this time, and summoning the centurion, he questioned him as to whether He was already dead. <sup>45</sup> And ascertaining this from the centurion, he granted the body to Joseph. <sup>46</sup> Joseph bought a linen cloth, took Him down, wrapped Him in the linen cloth and laid Him in a tomb which had been hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. <sup>47</sup> Mary Magdalene and Mary the *mother* of Joses were looking on *to see* where He was laid.
