### Passage of Study Luke 22:24-30

<sup>24</sup> And there arose also a dispute among them *as to* which one of them was regarded to be greatest. <sup>25</sup> And He said to them, “The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who have authority over them are called ‘Benefactors.’ <sup>26</sup> But *it is* not this way with you, but the one who is the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like the servant. <sup>27</sup> For who is greater, the one who reclines *at the table* or the one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines *at the table*? But I am among you as the one who serves.

<sup>28</sup> “You are those who have stood by Me in My trials; <sup>29</sup> and just as My Father has granted Me a kingdom, I grant you <sup>30</sup> that you may eat and drink at My table in My kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.
