A. The Great White Throne Judgment will be a terrifying event.

(See Revelation 20:11; Psalm 9:7-8; Revelation 20:11; Psalm 102:25-27; II Peter 3:10; Isaiah 51:6; II Peter 3:10; Mark 13:31; Hebrews 4:13; Luke 8:17; Romans 2:16)

B. No one appointed to be at this judgment will escape it.

C. The Great White Throne Judgment is *not* for believers.

(See Revelation 20:12-13; Ephesians 2:8-9; Titus 3:5-6;

Matthew 10:14-15; Mark 12:38-40; Ecclesiastes 3:11)

D. Death and Hades will be destroyed in the Lake of Fire.

E. Those not found in the Book of Life will experience the Second Death.

Passage of Study Revelation 20:11-15

¹¹ Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat upon it, from whose presence earth and heaven fled away, and no place was found for them. ¹² And I saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and books were opened; and another book was opened, which is *the book* of life; and the dead were judged from the things which were written in the books, according to their deeds. ¹³ And the sea gave up the dead which were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead which were in them; and they were judged, every one *of them* according to their deeds. ¹⁴ Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. ¹⁵ And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire.
